Animal Welfare League

Narooma Dog Training Club is a Branch of Animal Welfare League NSW. If you would like to become a member and support the work of the Animal Welfare League NSW, a separate form and fee is available from the Secretary.

CLASSES

Classes are conducted every Saturday afternoon, except on Public Holiday weekends.

Obedience Classes for beginner, intermediate and advanced levels begin at 2pm, for one hour.

Agility Classes for eligible dogs begins at 3.30pm, for one hour, provided there are sufficient numbers on the day. All participants are required to assist with the setup and dismantling of equipment.

Rally O Training as per calendar.

New enrolments are welcome the 1st Saturday of each month at 1.30pm, beginning in February. Puppies are accepted into Obedience over 3 months and into Agility over 9 months of age. Dogs over 9 months are accepted into both Obedience and Agility. All dogs must demonstrate basic obedience training before taking part in Agility. All dogs must be vaccinated and proof of vaccination is required at the time of registration.

Three Handlers Days, Agility and Rally O competitions are held each year with 1st, 2nd and 3rd place awards given. **Promotions** are also made throughout the year. Handlers who demonstrate the required standard will be promoted to the next level.

Trophies are awarded at the end of each calendar year – limit of one per handler.

RULES

- * All handlers are responsible for the behaviour of their dog.
- * All dogs must be kept under control at all times, either by their handler or other responsible person.
- * All handlers must wear enclosed footwear (not thongs), clothing and sun protection.
- * All handers must bring a collar or halter and lead, a small bag of dog treats, and plastic bags for disposal of dog waste to class.
- * All dogs must undergo the Canine Health Check before proceeding onto the training ground.
- * All dogs must be on lead on the training ground from 1.30pm.
- * All handlers to be ready for class at 2pm.

Health and Safety - we suggest that handlers seek medical advice regarding a tetanus vaccination.

A Risk Assessment of the training ground takes place each week. A First Aid Kit is available on site. Please report any accident or injury to your Instructor. Free water and sunscreen station is available.

Be a good member - pay attention to announcements, read the notice board, and practice with your dog at home. Instructors are all very experienced dog handlers who volunteer their time and expertise. Any problems, please ask their advice first or consult your trusted Veterinary Surgeon.
