In other important news, we signed a new pet food supply agreement with Nestlé Purina. While the contract is still in the early stages, we are confident it will deliver a better outcome for our Branches and pets.

The Animal Welfare League NSW Board recently signed off on a new three-year corporate strategic plan which will drive the organisation forward. This roadmap will guide us in our mission to help more animals on their journey to a loving home. It is a roadmap that will also help us navigate the challenges, like the rising cost-of-living for pet owners, and the spike in cat population, while ensuring we have the resources to support our network of services.

### Long time coming... Teddy finds his forever home




