FROM THE PRESIDENT

Hello – this is the second edition of the Woofer Newsletter for 2025. A warm welcome to all new handlers who have joined our program since April. We hope you enjoy the experience of dog training with us, meet new friends and bond well with your four legged friend.

Narooma Dog Training Club (NDTC) is a Branch of the NSW Animal Welfare League. Our key remit is canine education. As such, we are particularly delighted to support handlers who have taken on a rehomed dog from any of the animal rescue organisations that we are fortunate to have operating in our region. So far, 7 newly rehomed dogs have joined the obedience training program this year. These dogs come with a past, some of which was not particularly happy, and some of which is totally unknown at the time the dog went into the care of rescue personnel. Taking care of any dog, especially a rescue dog, involves patience, understanding, and the creation of a welcoming environment at home. It's crucial that rescue dogs are given time and space to settle into new surroundings, and to bond with their new owners. Establishing a routine, and providing consistent and regular training, are keys to the successful rearing of a happy companion dog. To give you some hope of how placid and trained your rescue can become, just take note of Odessa and I walking about. She was under nourished and aggressive towards men when I got her – now she is a honey.

Working behind the scenes to keep our Saturday program running smoothly are a voluntary Committee and team of Instructors. As with most community based organisations, Committee positions such as President, Vice-President, Treasurer and Secretary are elected at an Annual General Meeting. These people must be financial members of the NDTC Branch of the NSW Animal Welfare League. Other volunteers like our Instructors, Official Photographer and Work Health & Safety Officer are likewise members of NDTC Branch. If you would like to help us with the running of NDTC, please have a chat with me or any of the ladies you meet each Saturday as you sign in for training. We love new volunteers!

Speaking of volunteers, a big thank you to Jock McKellar who has recently 'retired' from the job of bringing the agility trailer back and forth to NATA Oval. His support has been greatly appreciated.

NDTC RULES

- All dogs to be kept on lead in class, unless requested by the Instructor.
- All handlers agree to be responsible for the behavior of their own dog, both ON or OFF lead.
- Children are welcome, but must be under direct parental supervision at all times. Please note children are not covered by AWL insurance.
- Handlers are advised to consult their medical professional regarding tetanus injections.
- NDTC recommends that dog owners hold public liability, in case of accidents or incidents.
- All handlers are asked to wear their name badges to all NDTC classes.
- Handlers are asked to wear appropriate footwear - high heels, sandals and thongs are not suitable when training a dog.
- Lessons will start at the advertised times – if late, you will miss part of the lesson.
- Be a good NDTC handler - read the notice board, listen to announcements and practice exercises between weekly lessons.
- Please remember that all Instructors and other NDTC workers are volunteers. Please be respectful of their generosity. It will help NDTC run more smoothly if you offer assistance when required.
- A first aid kit is available at the ground. See your Instructor if you require assistance.
- Nata Oval is open to the public, so please clean up all dog droppings.
- NDTC conducts a risk assessment of the training area and removes any offending material before classes commence. Nata Oval is a drug, alcohol and smoke free area.

FEES for 2025

Annual registration fee for renewing handlers is payable from February 2025.

\$40 Adult; \$25 Concession/Junior (over 9 and under 18 years); \$60 Family (any family combination).

Half Year registration fees are reduced for renewing handlers, commencing from 1 August.

Basic Obedience Program - \$50 for a 2month program. Bookings essential.

Ground Fee - a fee of \$5.00 per handler is payable each week on attendance.

FROM THE CHIEF INSTRUCTOR

It is believed that all dogs have evolved from wolves. As we know, wolves live in packs with a hierarchy. It can be beneficial to remember that we are the pack leader and our dogs need to know where their place is in the family dynamics, and what is expected of them. Being a pack leader doesn't mean being a bully - it means calmly but firmly instructing your dog as to what you require them to do.

There are small, gentle ways to instill in our dogs that we are in fact, the bosses.

- * When going in or out of a door or gate always go first, even if it's just one step.
- * If your dog is in the way don't go around them, move them out of the way by shuffling your feet while moving towards them until they move.
- * Don't feed your dog at the same time as you are eating. Where possible, feed them after yourself, even if you take just a bite of food first - and of course, always get them to sit or drop before giving a release command to eat.
- * If you have an indoor dog, it's best that they have their own bed or crate area - but if they sit on the furniture with you remember to show your dominance, sit down first, get your dog to sit on the floor first and then invite them up. Don't let them hog the chair or sofa, make sure you have enough room for you. The same applies in the bedroom. Ideally, they should have their own bed but if your dog sleeps on your bed they should be at the bottom end. Never let them sleep with their heads level with your own.
- * Don't let your dog jump up on you or anyone else.
- * Your dog should work for rewards. Ask them to perform an obedience task before giving them treats, toys etc. Mix it up, drop, stay, come or any trick - not just sit.
- * When correcting unacceptable behaviour always remember to let your dog know what you do want them to do and praise them when they do it.

Your dog's training is a life-long occupation, it's not just dog school on a Saturday morning. It is a combination of clear leadership and consistent training in your everyday life that will bring results.

STORAGE SHED UPDATE

Progress Report! The online Community Consultation process required by Council, has successfully concluded and following an onsite meeting with representatives from Narooma Rotary all concerns expressed by members of the community have been resolved. We are grateful to our volunteer architect/draftsman Michael Robinson, who completed a final revision of the building plan, making the small adjustments needed to meet everyone's requirements.

We are ready to build! New quotes have been gathered and we are pushing hard with Council staff to get the green light to start. It has been just over 2 years since Peter Nelipa and I made our presentation to the Mayor and Councillors – a long haul for such a small structure and at times, very trying on our patience. We are currently working through the challenges of another change in Council staff, but are determined to see the project off the drawing board and out of the ground before this year is out. Watch this space!

A BIG THANKYOU to everyone who has contributed donations over the past 8 years – these funds have been accumulating and are waiting in our bank account specifically to pay for the storage shed. VISITING INSTRUCTORS

From time to time, we are delighted to welcome visiting Instructors to our Saturday Obedience program. Saturday 14 June was a bumper day for such visits! Jeff Chivall from Horsham Dog Training Club was in town, along with two other Instructor colleagues from the same club. Jeff was a friend of NDTc Founder, the late Yve Robinson, and has been a visiting Instructor with us for many years. We welcome his ongoing interest in helping handlers, especially in the top classes, polish their skills.

It is important to note that Horsham Dog Training Club is a 'tralling' club. By this we mean that their Instructors train dogs to ANKA competition standard, whereas we are mainly interested in helping you develop your dog as a companion. Whilst the Horsham club training methods are well worth thinking about, some do differ from ours. We use praise and treats to achieve trust between a dog and its handler. We try not to push or pull on our dogs and we never use check chains in training. Both of those methods can be effective when used correctly, but our animal welfare philosophy steers us away from these methods. For us, kindness and reward make for a happy combination of dog and owner. But this is not to say that you can't learn from others! You only have to do a quick search on the internet to find a wide range of animal behaviour techniques that people use to train their dog. So do listen to what visiting Instructors have to say – they have 'pearls of wisdom' to offer – then use your judgement as to whether or not you want to take their advice on board. After all, we are all aiming for the same end result – a strong and loving bond between you and your dog.
